#### **NEW ACCESSIBILITY TOOLS FOR PENNSYLVANIANS**



The Free Library of Philadelphia, Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh, and The Pennsylvania Office of Commonwealth Libraries, along with guidance from Wall-to-Wall Studios is excited to announce a new central location for library patrons in Pennsylvania.

The Library of Accessible Media for Pennsylvanians (LAMP) offers people who cannot access the printed word a way to restore their love of reading by shipping - for free - materials in accessible formats like braille, audio, described movies, and large print directly to patrons across Pennsylvania. In addition to physical content, LAMP also provides digital access to downloadable audio or braille to hundreds of thousands of titles. If you cannot read standard print due to blindness, a

visual disability, or because you can't hold a book or turn pages or, if you have a reading disability such as dyslexia - then this service is for you.

#### **HIDDEN HAPPY VALLEY**

What if you could take a ten-minute journey back in time, open a window into local life, and glimpse a sense of community from the past with no limitations except your own time and imagination?


That's what a new historical video series, Hidden Happy Valley, which <u>premiered</u> on June 26, aims to offer thanks to a collaboration between several local organizations.

Our team at Centre County Library & Historical Museum has teamed up with Schlow Centre Region Library, the Happy Valley Adventure Bureau, and Local Historia to offer the free series of short, virtual experiences that focus on the lesser known history behind favorite spots across the region. Part tour, part lecture, Hidden Happy Valley will be released on our <u>YouTube Channel</u> one episode per month in June, July, and August,

Local historians Matt Maris and Dustin Elder moderate each episode on location from special spots in Philipsburg, Boalsburg, and Howard. Each video offers a ten-minute guided tour showcasing places and spaces filled with history and spotlighting Centre County life in a unique way. The collaborating organizations have decided to keep specifics about each "community gem" featured in the series a surprise until the videos are released.

Watch the Hidden Happy Valley <u>trailer</u>, connect to the series on <u>YouTube</u>, and then head out for fun and adventure by visiting each location in person. Episode 2 premieres July 24, and the final episode will be released August 28 on each organization's YouTube Channel.

## "MEET N' TREAT" WITH THE TAIL WAGGIN' TUTORS


